### **Spalding, Martin John Collection**

ALS M.J. Spalding to E.A. Palmer, regarding a speaking engagement. Martin John Spalding became Bishop of Louisville in 1848 and served in that position until 1864, when he became Archbishop of Baltimore. The "Custom House" referred to at the end of the letter is probably the US Custom House that was located at the Port of Louisville. The letter was found in *Life of Archbishop Spalding* by A.J. Spalding in the University Archives, Special Collections (BX5705 .S73 S6) and is transcribed as follows:

Louisville, Jany. 19, 1860

Dear Sir;

I promised to let you know when I would be able to accept your very kind invitation to lecture before the Young Catholic Friends' Society of your city. Divine Providence permitting, I may do so on Thursday, 23<sup>rd</sup> of Feby, the day after Ash Wednesday. The subject may be "The Crescent & the Cross." Please let me know whether this time & subject will suit. In fact, I can't scarcely change it, as I will have other appointments.
